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RYLA is an intensive program that brings young adults together from ages 18-30 to further develop character and leadership skills and learn about Rotary.

District 9790 RYLA Conference is an experience-based conference consisting of 7 days and 6 nights organised by previous RYLArians, Rotaractors and Rotarians from across the District.

Participants are nominated by local Rotary clubs or self-nominate after hearing about the conference through friends.



## rotary youth exchange

Rotary Youth Exchange is an incredible opportunity for young people to learn a new culture and gain invaluable life skills. Rotary International, a worldwide network of volunteer-based service clubs, organises these exchanges to build global understanding and peaceful resolution of conflicts.

This program typically lasts one year and involves both inbound and outbound students. Inbound students are hosted by Rotary clubs in their destination country and stay with several different host families during their stay.

Outbound students are sponsored by a local Rotary club in their home country and placed in a host family in their destination country.

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#### Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment

RYPEN is a weekend away program for young people (Years 9 & 10).

Its principal aim is to communicate to participants a series of ideas, problems and social experiences which will assist them in forming their own values and moral standards and allow them to broaden their horizons culturally, socially and academically.

Activities focus on increasing selfesteem and leadership skills as well as opportunities for them to think about understanding themselves and how they relate to others.
